Read the promises of the coming day of salvation in Isa 29:18-19, 35:5-6, and 61:1. How do we see the fulfillment of this in Jesus' response to John? What was Jesus' purpose in sending this message to John?

Matt 11:4-5

Jesus did not meet cultural expectations. If we are to follow Him, in what ways should we defy cultural expectations? What will people think of us as followers of Jesus?
